ERRIN - The voice of regions supporting EU decision-makers in place-based R&I policy

<u>ERRIN</u> – European Regions Research and Innovation Network – is a Brussels-based network that supports regional and local stakeholders in developing their innovation ecosystems and enhancing research and innovation (R&I) capacities through collaboration and partnerships.

As the new political cycle begins, European competitiveness, strategic autonomy and addressing the feeling of disconnect between citizens and the EU are among the major issues on the table. Fostering collaboration in R&I is key to helping Europe prosper in the wider geopolitical context. At the same time, maintaining the link with the needs and realities of territories is crucial to ensure optimal impact of policies and keeping people at the centre of the European project.

HOW CAN ERRIN SUPPORT EUROPEAN DECISION MAKERS

ERRIN brings together 120 regions and their research and innovation ecosystems from across 22 European countries. The network mobilises key R&I stakeholders – public authorities, academia, the private sector and civil society. While facing different challenges, our members invest in research and innovation, local and regional development and contribute to making Europe more competitive. Together, we work bottom-up on European R&I policy and funding and foster experience sharing, mutual learning and collaboration.

ERRIN combines the diverse experiences and expertise at regional and local level where transformations take place. At the same time, we are not only focused on transforming our members' regions but also on connecting their innovation ecosystems to become drivers of change at the European level.





Strengthening research, innovation and competitiveness – insights from 120 regional ecosystems

At this pivotal time for Europe, with the Commission's proposals for the next Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) and the Framework Programme for Research and Innovation (FP10) getting closer, European Regions Research and Innovation Network (ERRIIN) is pleased to provide inputs on how the EU can create the right conditions for R&I to thrive for a competitive Europe post-2027.

Even with the strong recognition of the value of innovation ecosystems as essential for competitiveness in key documents like such as the Draghi report, the importance of the place-based dimension of innovation and competitiveness is not covered, leaving a gap in the current policy discussions. However, a thriving European innovation ecosystems, essential for enhancing Europe's competitiveness, resilience and strategic autonomy. Without full participation of Europe's diverse regional ecosystems, enhanced competitiveness, strategic autonomy in key technological domains as well as the implementation of EU Green Deal will remain out of reach. A standalone FP10 is necessary to ensure a strong research and innovation dimension in the next MFF, putting innovation at the heart of the European economy and ensuring strong collaboration dimension within EU and between third countries.

The next EU long-term budget must not rely solely on top-down measures focused on a limited number of industrial sectors. Europe also needs to base its measures and investments on technology pull and real demand on the ground. Recognising the diversity of realities and conditions of cities and regions across Europe, and maintaining a close connection with territories, is crucial for ensuring that EU policies and programmes have high impact and keep citizens at the core of the European project.

The following 10 recommendations are based on insights gathered from the 120 regional ecosystems that ERRIN brings together across Europe, based on our comprehensive paper series <u>Towards the 10th Framework Programme</u>.



ERRIN key messages on the future of \$3

Introduction

As the EU enters a critical phase of policy discussions for the post-2027 programming period, ERRIN members have reflected on the experiences of Smart Specialisation Strategies (S3) so far and what is needed to ensure their continued relevance and impact in a new global landscape with priorities increasingly centred around European competitiveness. This report is based on the insights gathered during an interactive session between ERRIN members, where discussions focused on three key themes crucial for S3 post-2027: the strategic role of Smart Specialisation, governance and stakeholder engagement and interregional collaboration.

For ERRIN members, Smart Specialisation Strategies have proven to be a valuable and effective tool for strengthening innovation-driven regional development and fostering collaboration within and between R&I ecosystems. The place-based approach of S3 has been key for supporting regions in identifying their unique strengths and opportunities to maximise their R&I potential. The stakeholder engagement in S3 has been effective in many regions, bringing together key R&I actors – businesses, universities, public authorities and civil society – to shape priorities collaboratively, which has strengthened their regional R&I ecosystems. Another key strength of S3 is its potential to bridge multiple policy areas – regional policy, research and innovation policy and industrial policy – and foster synergies between them, which has not yet been fully unleashed in practice. In parallel, cohesion policy should adopt a more innovative approach more broadly, mainstreaming innovation throughout its priorities, beyond key objective one, with Smart Specialisation as an enabler.


